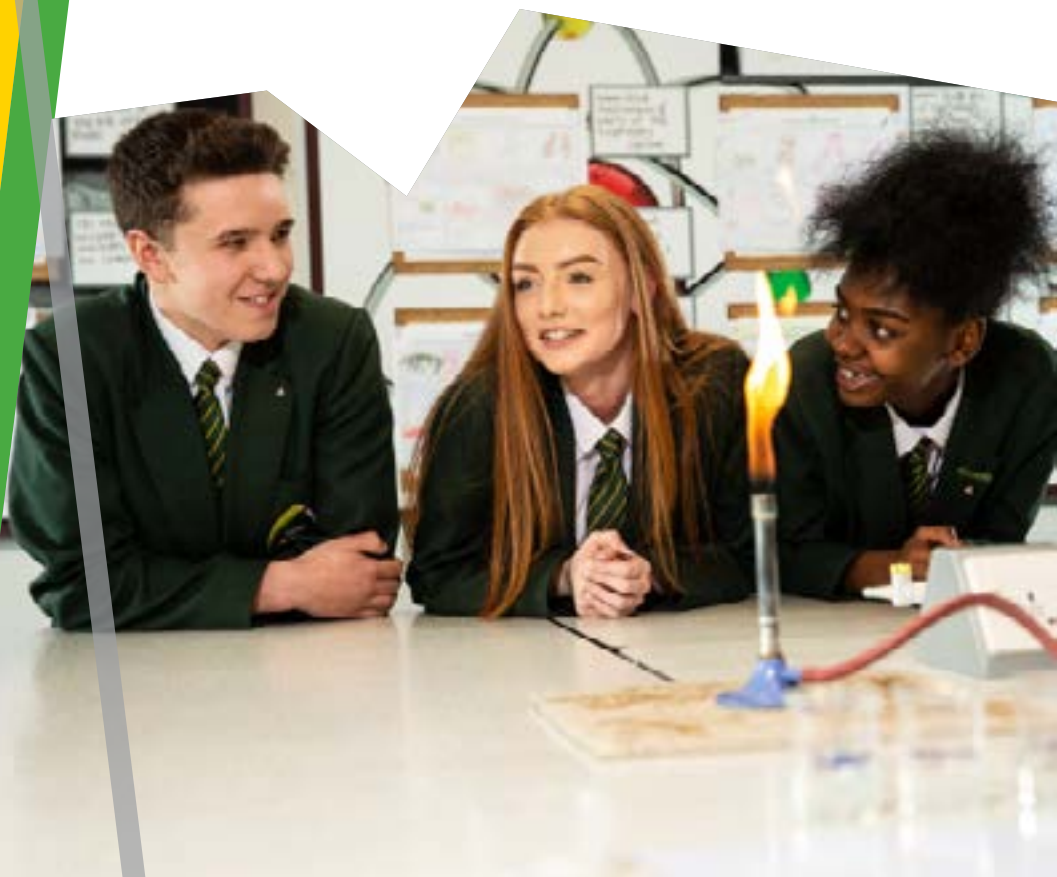

An academy based on Christian values...

Trinity Academy is here to serve the local community, and as part of this we welcome students, parents and carers of all faiths and none. However, our ethos is based on four key Christian values - Empathy, Honesty, Respect and Responsibility.

These four values underpin every aspect of daily life at the academy. They form the basis of our Behaviour for Learning Policy, the way we work and our expectations of ourselves and each other.

We strongly believe that each and every individual can live by, and benefit from, these values, regardless of religion or beliefs. Students will participate in regular events to reflect upon the importance of them. These include collective worship and using the Trinity Academy Prayer during Vertical Tutoring time as part of our daily two minute silence. This prayer was developed by our students, and is based around our four core values.

Striving for 100% attendance...

Our students enjoy coming to the academy - this is reflected in our overall attendance figures which are above the national average.

All our students are encouraged to aim for 100% attendance. High attendance has a significant impact on results - last year, students who met or exceeded the academy's target attendance achieved half a grade more than those students who didn't in their GCSE examinations.

As a parent we encourage you to discuss with your child the importance of high attendance - they will not only achieve their potential, but will also be rewarded for maintaining excellent attendance and behaviour.

We understand that at times your child may be unable to attend due to illness or due to exceptional circumstances. If this is the case, you can contact us in a variety of ways:

Simple, efficient and convenient communication

In July 2017 the academy became 'paperless'. This means that the majority of communication, including letters, newsletters, the Student Progress Reports and information about Behaviour and Achievement Points will be issued via email/electronically. Text messages will continue to be used for urgent messages. Some key benefits include:

- Dedicated iPhone/Android app: this provides a one stop shop to view all Achievement and Behaviour Points, attendance information, Student Progress Reports.
- Student Progress Reports: these will be issued electronically, and stored electronically, allowing you to access previous reports quickly and easily.
- Regular eNewsletters will keep you up-to-date with the latest news at Trinity Academy - direct to your inbox.

We encourage you to download the iPhone/Android app from your app store.

Further detailed information will be available under the 'key information' tab of www.trinityacademyhalifax.org. Please note, parents can request communication in alternative formats where required.

At Trinity Academy, we hugely value a positive working relationship with parents and carers who support our students to succeed. We also believe in modelling positive behaviour so that students witness how adults should behave with regard to respect and tolerance towards other people.

On very rare occasions parents of students at Trinity Academy have displayed various degrees of abuse to academy staff which is something that will not be tolerated. May we politely remind parents that threatening behaviour against staff or other members of the academy community will not be tolerated. We have a right to expect that our school is a safe place in which to work and learn and there is no place for threatening or abusive behaviour of any kind.

If parents display abuse we will be forced to consider removing their licence to enter the academy grounds and buildings. Thank you for your continued support.

All Year 7 students join our Graduation programme

At Trinity Academy Halifax, our Year 8 students 'graduate' at the end of Phase 1. This aims to raise their aspirations, and help make students feel more motivated for their upcoming GCSE studies.

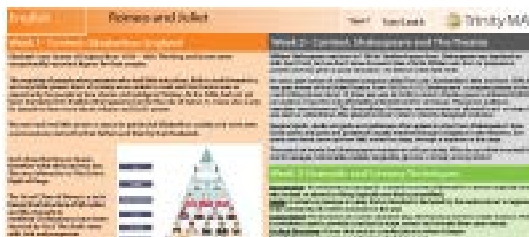
As Year 7 students, your child will be enrolled in the programme and work towards graduating from Phase 1. At the end of their two year journey, parents will be invited to celebrate their child's achievements at a memorable ceremony, complete with traditional cap and gown. Being able to graduate requires students to meet a number of minimum requirements around behaviour, attendance, meeting subject targets and participation in extra-curricular and public speaking events.

Students are regularly updated and advised so they are aware of their progress towards these targets. All students receive a Graduation Journal, so they can check whether they are on track and set targets accordingly. Graduation targets are explored in more detail at Parental Consultation Evenings, but parents can also discuss these with their child at home before each term begins.

Year 7 Knowledge Organisers

As part of the curriculum at Trinity Academy Halifax, students are required to gain key knowledge in all their subjects. To support this acquisition of knowledge, all students will be provided with 'knowledge organisers' for English, Maths, Science, History, Geography, French or Spanish. As part of their weekly homework students will be expected to revise from each knowledge organiser in preparation for a termly multiple choice test.

This knowledge will equip them not only to understand each subject in more depth and set the foundations for GCSE study, but will also help them to understand the world around them. This method of study has proven very successful with current Year 7 and 8 students in providing both them and their parents/carers with an overview of the knowledge they are gaining on a term by term basis.



Structure of the academy day and punctuality...

Lessons start at 8.15am and the first bell rings at 8.10am. All students are expected to be on-site ready for the first bell. Students who are not in the building at 8.10am when the first bell rings will receive a late mark. Punctuality is a key focus at the academy - not only does this ensure that our young people get the most from their lessons, it also helps them prepare for a professional environment in the future.

Lessons last one hour and the academy operates a split lunch and break system by year groups. The table summarises breaks by year groups. All students finish timetabled lessons at 2.20pm, Year 7 and 8 students are expected to take part in a Graduation club once a week that finishes at 3.20pm.

Year 8 and 10 12.50pm - 1.20pm

Timetabled lessons finish for all students at 2.20pm. At this point students will participate in our INVOLVE and Achieve activities.

Please log on to ParentPay before your child starts with US...

ParentPay is a nationally recognised, secure online system that allows you to pay the academy for everything from meals to trips. By topping up your account your child can make the most of their breaks. Benefits of the system include:

- Completely secure and easy to use
- You can see what food your child has been purchasing
- Saves you from searching for cash and improves the security of payments
- If your child receives Free School Meals you can top this up so they can make a purchase in the morning or at break
- Pay for trips in affordable instalments
- Support available if you are unsure of how it works.



Your log-in details and information will be provided in preparation for your child's start date - please do log on and top up your child's account.

Support for students at Trinity Academy...

Our pastoral care - or the support we provide to students - is something that we are proud of at Trinity Academy. Over these next two pages you will be able to see how this works in practice and how it is available to support you and your child during your journey with us.

Transition support

Our staff work to support students as they move from primary to secondary school and ensure that this is as smooth as possible.

The support that we put in place will differ depending on the individual student. It could range from simply answering questions to putting some specific support systems in place. We also meet with staff in primary schools to gain a better understanding of the students who are joining the academy.

The College Manager team

At the heart of our pastoral system are our College Managers. Each student within Trinity Academy belongs to one of six colleges (logos pictured below). Each of these colleges is headed by a College Manager and supported by Deputy College Managers, who take responsibility for the leadership of pastoral care and support of students within each college.

The team has a fantastic relationship with the students in their care; students report that they feel part of a real 'college family'.

Vertical Tutoring system

All students belong to a college, and within each of these colleges is a tutor group of a number of students who range in age from Year 7 right up to Year 11. Each group is led by at least two tutors, who arrange activities that nurture students and encourage them to form strong bonds within their groups. Younger students are able to get to know older ones, whilst as students move up within the academy they are given leadership opportunities.

Trinity Academy Absolutes

We are an outstanding academy with high aspirations for students and a traditional approach to discipline and behaviour.

All students are expected to live by the Trinity Absolutes which set the standard for success. These help students prepare for the future and remind them of the importance of requirements such as impeccable uniform, punctuality and being equipped to learn at all times.

The Trinity Absolutes are displayed throughout the academy, including all classrooms. See further information on page 10.

Students who consistently meet our expectations are rewarded with Achievement Points - see below.

Recognising excellent behaviour...

Trinity Academy has a real focus on rewarding excellent behaviour, and ensuring students understand the consequences of any poor behaviour.

The academy has a clear Behaviour for Learning Policy which outlines how positive behaviour is celebrated, and how any issues will be addressed. We recognise students through Achievement Points, which are awarded when students meet our expectations. A Behaviour Point is given when a student has failed to meet our expectations, and will affect the overall balance of points and subsequent eligibility for Rewards Weeks.

Our policies...

• Attendance Policy

This outlines the importance of high attendance and punctuality, and how we will work with you and other agencies when this is not of an expected level. You are also expected to inform us should your child be absent due to illness, and this policy also outlines how holidays during term time will not be authorised.

• Behaviour for Learning

Underpinning our Behaviour for Learning rewards system, this policy outlines how all staff will reward good behaviour and support students to understand our expectations.

• Collective Worship

As a Christian academy, our Collective Worship policy outlines how we will build the self-esteem, confidence and empathy of our students through provision of regular opportunities for collective worship, whilst reflecting that our student body includes those of all faiths and none.

• Complaints Procedure

Although the academy works closely with all parents to ensure that there is mutual two way communication in all matters, in the event of you wishing to make a complaint, this policy outlines the steps you will need to take and how your complaint will be reviewed.

• Inclusion and SEN

Trinity Academy supports all students to achieve their potential, regardless of ability. We work closely with you should your child have any needs, or if we have identified that they may require extra support. Our approach in this area is governed by a number of policies and statutory requirements - please contact us for further information.

Helping your child to prepare...

Trinity Academy has comprehensive support in place for all students. We are determined that each and every student will get the most from their time here.

The Home-Academy Agreement outlines our expectations and what you can expect from us. We encourage you to discuss this with your son/daughter.

Uniform success...

- Blazer worn correctly with sleeves fully rolled down
- Shirt/blouse fully buttoned with tie worn correctly
- Smart black shoes - please note that pumps, suede footwear, boots and black trainers are not allowed
- Smart black pleated skirt /trousers - skirts with official academy logo
- Mobile telephones not used at any point during the academy day - please remember they will be confiscated if seen.



A smart uniform is crucial to success at Trinity Academy. The image above shows how students are expected to arrive each day. Please note that we do not allow pumps, long boots or black trainers to be worn. If a belt is worn this must be plain black leather (or leather look) with a non-decorative buckle. Students are also not allowed to bring hoodies to the academy. The academy uniform policy must be followed on students' journey to and from the academy.

The role of the Student Planner...

All students are supplied with their own Student Planner. This is a vital piece of equipment and students are expected to bring it to the academy each day.

It is also a useful tool for you - here you can view a record of the homework your child has been set, and see a weekly record of their behaviour and attendance.

As a parent you are asked to sign the planner each week (for the previous week) to show you have reviewed the homework set.



The Trinity Academy Anti-Bullying Treaty

Our academy community is a warm, welcoming one where students respect and support one another. As part of this, we have a real focus upon educating young people about bullying and its effects.

We work to educate students to understand how differences should be celebrated, and how as a community we support each other.

Our approach to anti-bullying will have an even higher profile for our new Year 7 students. Written by students and driven by our values, this reinforces our approach and is included in the Student Planner. All students will be asked to sign their planners to indicate their commitment to its principles and importance. We also have 'Anti-Bullying Ambassadors', who are students that have volunteered to make themselves available to fellow students who have any worries or need a little extra support.



Remember, our College Manager team are here to support all aspects of the settling in process and are available to both students and parents.

Trinity Academy Absolutes

The Trinity Academy Absolutes reflect the standards expected of all our young people.

Students who meet these standards are rewarded with Achievement Points. These simple requirements are key to the success of our young people. They are displayed in all classrooms and in the Student Planner as a reminder for students and staff.

All our young people attend a special assembly about the Trinity Absolutes and their importance.

The image to the left illustrates the posters displayed in every classroom - parents are encouraged to discuss the importance of meeting these basic requirements with their child before they start with us.



INVOLVE and Achieve is our extra-curricular and academic support programme for all students at Trinity Academy

The earlier start and finish times mean that students can take advantage of the huge range of activities on offer. There are two aspects to the programme 'INVOLVE' - which refers to activities such as our sports clubs and other extra-curricular opportunities and 'Achieve,' which relates to our academic support sessions. We recommend that all students participate in the opportunities on offer, and if a student is identified for an 'Achieve' session then they are expected to attend.

All sessions take place at the end of the academy day. We ask parents to support the success of their child by ensuring that they attend the Achieve sessions (students will be automatically booked on these).

FLIP!

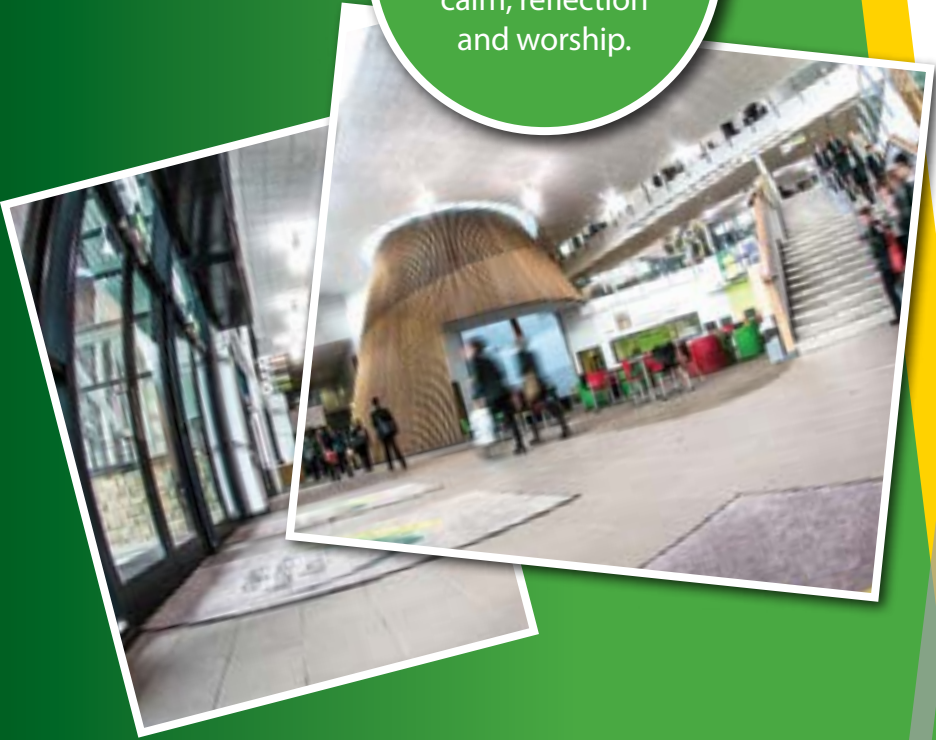
