(2) Desmond Doss

- Desmond Doss was a medic for the US military during World War 2.
- He was a dedicated Christian and held very strong beliefs. He strongly believed in the Commandment 'Thou shall not kill'.
- Unlike many soldiers he also refused to carry a gun or knife. He was determined that, no matter what situation he faced, he would not take the life of another human being. He was a contentious objector
- Desmond Doss single handedly saved 75 of his comrades, by lowering their bodies over Hacksaw ridge with a rope.
- He was awarded the medal of honour for his bravery and resilience and was the only solider to receive the medal without killing an enemy solider.



(3) Martin Luther King Jr

Martin Luther King Jr was an activist who led the civil rights movement in the United States from the mid-1950s until his death by assassination in 1968.



- After receiving his degree from Boston University, he became a pastor for the Dexter Avenue Baptist Church.
- Martin Luther King was influenced by Gandhi's policy of nonviolence.
- Martin Luther King gave over two and a half thousand speeches.
- His most famous speech was his "I have a dream" speech.



- He was an American Boxer and social activist who won the world heavyweight championship three times.
